# **Black History Month**

February is Black History Month in Canada. It is a time to honour the contributions and rich legacy of Black Canadians and their communities. The GECDSB is pleased to acknowledge and celebrate the very important role that African Canadians have played in the cultural, political, social, and economic progress of our community, in the past and present, through our locally developed Roads to Freedom documents. There is also a student symposium coming up on **March 21st, 2024**, for Black students called Celebrating Black Joy — Black Excellence. More information will be released as it comes.

#### **Environmental Stewardship/Waste Audit Findings**

- North America is the worst contributor to waste in the world. Canada is worse per capital. On average, we produce 6 lbs per person per day.
- There are currently 805 active landfills in Ontario 15 of them are considered Major and our regional landfill is one of those. That means we produce up to 4X more garbage than most areas

- Ontario produces around 12 million tonnes of waste a year (size is 12 million full grown male moose)
- In Ontario, if we don't make changes, we will be out of landfill space by 2034
- Many landfills have been approved for expansion, including Windsor and Blenheim. More than half of the expansion is coming to our area
- In Canada, we overshoot our resources by March 13th every year. As a planet, we overshoot by mid-August

#### Mental Health

Mental Health, Well-being and Engagement continues to be a Board and school priority. Current statistics show that 20% of students in Ontario ages 4-17 have significant mental health struggles (meet the criteria for diagnosis), which means the number is probably higher. There have been modules for grades 7-8 and will be for other grades in the future. The Board is developing a Three-Year Mental Health and Addictions Strategy, with representation from several staff members. This work is not silent – it is alongside all the equity and inclusion work that is also being done.

#### Solar Eclipse

Monday, April 8<sup>th</sup>, 2024 is the solar eclipse. Schools will be open, and transportation will run in the morning. We will be dismissing at 1 p.m. and there will be NO transportation at that time. All extracurricular activities will also be cancelled. The eclipse will be from 1:57pm - 3:17pm.
