Out-of-District Secondary School Application and Information

- 3. You must reside in Massey Secondary School boundaries if you wish for your child to attend Massey Secondary. Please complete the Out of District application for Massey noting you are selecting the English stream program (opting out of French Immersion).

<u>Vice Principal's Report – Mr Roy:</u>

Rationale:

Bellewood aims to improve student well-being, inclusivity, and belonging by addressing gaps in achievement and well-being for historically underserved students. This aligns with the 2024 School Climate Survey, the GECDSB Student Mental Health and Well-Being Action Plan, the Equity Action Plan, and preparations for the 2SLGBTQIA+ Action Plan.

Actions Taken:

1. Bellewood GSA Initiatives:

- o Reviewed 2SLGBTQIA+ student data from the School Climate Survey, noting key issues such as trusted adult identification and bullying.
- Feedback included more staff education on 2SLGBTQIA+ issues, normalizing pronouns, emphasizing Human Rights, and combating negative perceptions.
- o Engaged a Board Social Worker specializing in 2SLGBTQIA+ support and planned a permanent Pridethemed art piece for the Learning Commons.

2. Refresh Committee:

o Grade 7-8 student artists will help create a Learning Commons art piece reflecting Bellewood's community demographics.

3. EAST Initiatives:

- Teachers exploring Black History Valise resources to enhance instructional programming, with support from an Equity Consultant.
- o Expanded Equity Consultant support to prepare for Ramadan, Asian Heritage, and Jewish Heritage initiatives.

4. Create Your Future (CYF) Program:

o Invited CYF advisors to increase participation and reintroduce this program supporting racialized students academically and emotionally.

5. Caring and Safe Schools Update:

o **Ball Strike Prevention:** Committee formed to address staff injuries from ball strikes, with the goal of reducing incidents.

Trusted Adults Map:

- Surveyed students (K-8) to identify trusted adults in the school community.
- Results showed high identification rates for trusted adults in Grades K-3 but a need for improvement in Grades 4-8 (88% with trusted adults, 11% without).
- Goal: Increase students with trusted adults to at least 97% (reduce 11% baseline to 3% or less).
- Approved for a grant during Bullying Awareness and Prevention Week to support this initiative.
- VP and CYW will lead teaching sessions for younger students on identifying and utilizing trusted adults.
- Parent/guardian feedback will be collected through the PIC to support the initiative
