Read/Move-a-thon School Fundraiser Update

Thank you Ecole Bellewood students, parents/caregivers and larger school community! We had an incredibly successful school fundraising campaign this year, thanks to the very generous support of our Bellewood parents, extended families, and larger community!

Funding that comes from the Ministry of Education does not cover extra things that have come to be an important part of student life at Bellewood. Fundraising helps us take care of the many resources, special events, speakers, busses for field trips and school athletic events, referees for games, Good News Tickets, student rewards, lunch monitor incentives, technology, graduation supplies, mathematics competitions, recess equipment, primary agendas, gym sports equipment and many other things that we utilize throughout the year for our students.

The top three sellers in the school will win a prize. First prize will be a tablet, second prize will be a bicycle, and third prize will be a Gift Certificate to Clip'n Climb Windsor! For each \$10.00 a student brings in, they received one ballot for a chance to win prizes. Prizes for the daily ballot draws may include popcorn, books, basketballs, volleyballs, soccer balls, board games and various other items. The class that brings in the most money in each division (Early Years, Primary, Junior, and Intermediate) will also receive a pizza party!

School Renewal Project - Ontario Builds Signage

Ecole Bellewood is *currently* receiving upgrades to the original building (behind the scenes) to our BAS system. This includes upgrades to: Replacing old and faulty Sensors, Air Balancing, Changes to the Sequence of Operation, etc. As part of Ministry of Education requirements this year, school boards must display Ontario Builds signage at schools benefitting from school renewal projects.

Vice Principal's Report – Mr Roy:

Bullying Prevention and Mental Health Initiatives

The staff has been reviewing the school's well-being and inclusivity action plan and the importance of identifying trusted adults in the school.

The plan includes a school-wide mantra to promote a positive mindset and self-image, stress management, and community involvement. It discusses the importance of greeting and welcoming students daily to build trust and identify trusted adults. The plan includes proactive approaches to self-regulation and mental health, enhancing the knowledge of school staff and providing clear pathways for intervention.

Identifying a Trusted Adult

Students can identify at least one trusted adult in school, whether a teacher, principal, support staff, or custodian, who they can approach with concerns. This fosters a supportive environment in which they can express any concerns they have. All Kindergarten to grade 8 students will complete a survey in the coming weeks to identify their trusted adult. Results will be shared with their identified trusted adults, and no action is required from staff, but they will be aware that the student has identified them as a trusted adult.

Bullying Prevention Week and Words Matter

Bullying Prevention Week is the 3rd week in November and will be from November 18th - 22nd.

The activities for Bullying Prevention Week include the Words Matter presentation for grades five through eight.

The presentation covers:

- The Ontario Human Rights Code and the importance of acting as an upstander against discriminatory behaviour.
- Emphasizes the need for students to report discriminatory comments and the consequences for not doing so.

The plan includes supporting affected individuals, documenting incidents, and educating staff and students on appropriate responses.

Teacher's Report – Mme Matos:

- The Robotics club is up and running.
- There is a math competition coming up for grades 7 and 8
- MME Dandy and her team applied for a grant
- Carnaval that is coming up in the new year
- The book fair is going on November 12th -15th, and volunteers are needed for that event.
- The cereal box challenge is happening from November 4th 22nd. Donations will be going towards the Breakfast Club for the School Board programs.
- Funds requested on behalf of the grade 8 teachers to allocate funds for our graduates for them to have a wonderful evening before heading off to high school.
- Funds requested for teachers/classrooms to support their programs to be used by May 1, 2025. We have 28 homerooms and 5 specialty teachers (33 total).
