History Corner – DeGurse-McEwan House

The DeGurse-McEwan house, built in 1892, is a charming Queen Anne Vernacular style dwelling. The 2-storey, wooden clapboard home is situated on Kildare Road, north of Wyandotte Street, in the former Town of Walkerville. It is recognized for its heritage value by the City of Windsor Bylaw 397-2004. It is named after Joseph DeGurse who built the home, and for Robert J. McEwen, whose family lived there for some 70 years.
