If you wish to contact your child's teacher, we encourage you to leave them a voicemail with specific instructions on how, and when the best time to call back would be. Staff typically respond within 48 hours. If the issue is urgent, please call our office staff and provide details of your concern. Our office staff will be happy to assist. We are proud of our students and the work that we do to support them. We deeply appreciate your support and know that we are here to support our students and parents.

School Safety

We take pride in ensuring that our students are safe at General Brock! As part of our "Safe Welcome", we ask for your help each day so that we can always keep our students safe.

If your child is absent, please ensure that you call the school before 8:35 am. If your child needs to leave

the school before the end of the day, please ensure that you send a note to your child's teacher or phone the school office—we will greet you at the front doors with your child/ren. **Do not park in the bus bay or parking lot. These areas are off limits for parking to ensure student safety before and after school.** With your help, we know that we can create an even safer environment for our students!

EDSBY for Parents

What are the benefits of using Edsby?

Edsby is a great way to support your child at school. Many of our teachers will communicate and assign work through EDSBY.

Can I schedule an absence for my child using Edsby?

Yes, using Edsby you can schedule an absence for your child.

How will I know that I have been invited to Edsby?

You will receive a response to the email address you have provided the school for each child you have in the school where parents have been invited.

What do I do if I forget my password? Where do I get help or support on how to use Edsby?

On the Edsby login screen there is a link for 'Can't Log In' - Click on this and enter your email address that you used when you registered for Edsby. An email will be sent with instructions to follow. Help is available at http://www.edsby.com/help/parents/

Allergies

We have many students and staff who have life-threatening allergies to **peas**, **eggs**, **latex**, **nuts**, **tree nuts** and **peanuts**. We are also a 'fragrance free zone' and do not permit perfume, cologne or other **fragrances**. When exposed to these substances, allergic children can become 'anaphylactic' meaning that a medical emergency may become imminent. These reactions can be fatal. For some students, these foods/scents must be ingested to result in a reaction while the allergy is 'airborne' which means that the smell alone can result in anaphylaxis. We deeply appreciate your support in doing your best to avoid sending these food items to school. Please know staff are trained annually in how to respond to students with anaphylaxis.

EarlyON Centre hours and activities at a glance

EarlyON Child and Family Centres (CFC) offer free high-quality programming for parents and caregivers with children ages birth to 6 years old. Centres are located throughout Windsor-Essex County and include virtual programming options. All programming aims to foster a sense of belonging, well-being, engagement and expression while meeting the following core services:

- Supporting early learning and development by offering programming to encourage children's learning through play, and to build positive child adult relationships;
- Engaging parents and caregivers through information sharing about child development, parenting, play, and inquiry-based learning;
- Offering pre and post natal support;
- Connecting families to the community by responding to parents and caregivers inquiring about their child's development. This can include offering screening, making referrals to health professionals or other specialized community services.



History Corner

The Ambassador Bridge is a tolled international suspension bridge across the Detroit River that connects Detroit, Michigan, United States, with Windsor, Ontario, Canada. 
