A Little Bit of Local History

Are you looking for a peaceful park to spend some time in this summer? Well, look no further than Mary E. Bibb park, located directly beside Mackenzie Hall (across the street and on the next block east from our school).



This park may not be filled with swings and play structures, but it is a serene place to sit and admire historic buildings, wrought iron fencing, and beautiful trees (6 different varieties of trees including oak, Austrian pine, Colorado blue spruce and maple). In years past, students from our school have worked together to help decorate the large blue spruce at the front of the park for Christmas. This park also has a large Victorian style wooden gazebo with tiered grassy areas surrounding it. This picturesque spot has been popular for outdoor weddings and photos.

What's more important, however, is the historical significance of the name that this park honours – Mary E. Bibb.


Mary was born in 1820, in Rhode Island. By 1847, she was teaching high school in Cincinnati, Ohio. While there, she became involved in anti-slavery activities and she met her future husband, Henry Bibb. The Fugitive Slave Act of 1850 in the U.S. made it very easy for slavecatchers to capture fugitive and free Blacks. That prompted Mary and Henry (who was an escaped slave himself) to move to Canada. They settled in Sandwich where they continued their anti-slavery activism. The couple frequently took fugitives into their home who had arrived in Sandwich via the <u>Underground Railroad</u>. Approximately 20,000 Black people settled in Canada between 1850 and 1860, hundreds of them coming through Sandwich daily. In 1851, they began publishing a newspaper called "<u>Voice of the Fugitive</u>", the first major newspaper targeted at <u>Black Canadians</u>. She wrote articles and shared interviews with newly arrived fugitives in Canada. She was noted for giving the newspaper a polished editorial style.




By the late 1850's Mary established schools for Black Canadians, and she was a founding member of the Anti Slavery Society of Windsor. She also operated a store selling women's accessories and apparel in Windsor from 1865 until 1871. Mary left Windsor in the 1870's to go back to the United States. She later died in Brooklyn, New York in 1877.

Mary has left a significant imprint on both Sandwich and all of Canada. Her husband Henry is also honoured locally as one of the 16 Black Historical figures featured on a mural in Paterson Park further down the street. So, next time you visit Mary E. Bibb Park or walk by the historical plaque located beside the sidewalk on Sandwich Street, take a moment to learn about and reflect on the legacy of Mary E. Bibb.
