## A Little Bit of Local History

Did you know that our little corner of the world (the corner of Sandwich and Brock) is filled with some fascinating history? Standing on our property (where our school now stands) was once a fortified barracks that had been used in the War of 1812. These barracks were first built in 1808. Around the barracks was a covered enclosure of hewn square timber which surrounded the present school grounds. Inside of this enclosure was a large stone barracks and other buildings for the sheltering of the troops and the storing of munitions of war.



This drawing from 1837-1838 shows the wood enclosure that surrounded the stone barracks (to the right of the picture). The church on the left side of the drawing is St. Johns church, which still exists today across the street from our school. That is what the church looked like before the church was rebuilt in 1871. Established in 1808, those stone barracks were the beginning of a school presence on our property for well over 200 years! The first school in those barracks was called the Western District Grammar School (also called the "Stone College").



The stone barracks were finally removed in about 1868, with the only remnants being the 3 large rectangular stone blocks that lie on our corner today. Next time you walk by those stone blocks, take a minute to read the historical plaque that is mounted on the upright stone block.




