1. Call to Order

The meeting was called to order at 1:00 p.m.

2. Land Acknowledgement

We acknowledge that we are on land and surrounded by water, originally inhabited by Indigenous Peoples who have travelled this area since time immemorial. This territory is within the lands honoured by the Wampum Treaties; agreements between the Anishinaabe (Ah-nish-e-naa-bay), Haudenosaunee (Hoe-den-oh-show-nee), Lenni (Len-eh) Lenape (Le-naw-pay) and allied Nations to peacefully share and care for the resources around the Great Lakes. Specifically, we would like to acknowledge the presence of the Three Fires Confederacy, Ojibwe (Oh-jib-way), Odawa (Oh-dah-wah), Potawatomi (Paw-taw-watt-ohme) and Huron/Wendat (Wen-dat) Peoples. We are dedicated to honouring Indigenous history and culture while remaining committed to moving forward respectfully with all First Nations, Inuit and Métis

5. Business Arising as a Result of the Minutes

There was no new business as a result of the minutes.

6. Special Education Presentation

Budget Survey

Presented by Superintendent of Business and the Treasurer of the GECDSB S. Armstrong. Superintendent Armstrong focused on the budget development process, legislative requirements, and funding allocations. The Board must develop and approve a balanced budget by June 2025, as mandated by the Education Act. The budget process includes planning, consultations, and finalization, ensuring alignment with the Board's mission, vision and strategic priorities.

Key points discussed included the education funding formula, which considers factors like student enrolment, class size and school needs. Special Education Funding (SEF) was highlighted with a total allocation of \$62.4 million for the 2024-2025 school year, including per-pupil, differentiated needs, complex supports, and specialized equipment. The Board faces a deficit which resulted in a Multi-Year Financial Recovery Plan to achieve a balanced budget by 2026-2027. Challenges such as political uncertainties, enrolment changes, and inflation were also noted, with opportunities for public consultation through surveys, emails, and delegate participation at committee meetings.

• Kindergarten Entry Planning Information Night

Superintendent Mills introduced J. Newton and B. Rota to the committee, who are currently working as Transition Service Navigators. This position, in part, helps parents/guardians navigate pathways to school. They are currently working with our communications officer to update the Board's website to include pre-school supports, early years supports and supports for students aged 6-12 years. This year the Board hosted it's first Parent Information Night, Kindergarten Entry Planning for September 2025 for Students Requiring Supports and Services. The night included a transition timeline, registration, observations, and meetings with school teams and community partners. Specialized services, like psychological support, speech language, behavior services, and rehabilitation therapies, were highlighted, along with guidance for families of children with hearing, vision, and developmental needs. The presentation emphasized partnerships with Indigenous communities, external agencies, and resources like the SmartStart Hub and John McGivney Children's Centre to ensure seamless transitions and tailored student support.

The team also shared upcoming events: An Evening with Dr. Todd Cunningham and Planning for Success to Adulthood.

7. Special Education Updates

Update on Restructuring Supports for Special Education
Superintendent Mills provided an update to the committee. A lot has been done, with
more to do. Communication with parents/guardians took place in November, all
principals reached out to families with students currently in RISE, we received
approximately 170 responses. Administrators were asked to acknowledge the change
and our commitment to ongoing support and invited input. Many themes were
developed from this consultation with parents, including academic support,
social/emotional support, teacher efficacy, professional development, resources,
staffing considerations, and community partnerships. We have consulted with
Superintendent of Student Well-Being as it relates to social/emotional support. Our
next steps include consultation with union partners, principals, and students. We
continue to review school profiles, our current resources, explore community
partnerships, consultation with other boards and applications for Removing Barriers
grants.

PD Updates

L. Bates shared the professional learning for January and February 2025. In January elementary ESS staff spent time engaged in discussing the key components of planning and implementing Behaviour Plans. Matt Bergman from Novak Education presented to secondary staff with a focus on "A Deeper Look at Firm Goals and Flexible Means".

February both Elementary and Secondary Educators, ESS and PSSP took part in the Provincial Priorities, achievement of learning outcomes in core academic skills, preparation of students for student success and student engagement and well-being.
