FROM THE DESK OF THE PRINCIPAL AND VICE PRINCIPAL ...

Dear Southwood Families,

May is the time of year when we start reflecting on the year that was and begin planning for the next school year. Each year, great time and effort is made to determine the appropriate classroom placement for our students. Classroom placements are a school decision that is based on careful collaboration with our school team, including sending and receiving teachers. Considerations for classroom placements include classroom dynamics, specific grouping needs such as academic, behavioural, and social needs, student profiles, personalities, gender balance, and the availability of support services. We always keep in mind the learning needs of the child when determining class placement. With this said, parents/guardians are invited to write a letter to our Principal, Mrs. Lowes, where there are specific requests regarding class placement based on what is best for a child's learning. While we cannot accept requests for specific teachers, we do try to grant requests that are based on the learning needs of our students. All requests must be made in writing, dated and signed, prior to **May 12th, 2023.** If you have made the same request in a previous year and it is still relevant, please make the request again this year. Please note that all class placements are TENTATIVE until Reorganization Day in September.

This month, as spring unfolds, we are looking forward to safely enjoying outdoor playtime in the schoolyard. To help promote a safer outdoor play environment, our school is participating in the GECDSB's **Outdoor Ball Strike Pilot Project.** The purpose of this pilot project is to develop best practices for physical activities, layout, expectations, and active supervision on our playground/hardtop to reduce and prevent ball strike types of accidents and injuries to both staff and students. Our hardtop play area has been painted to indicate high-energy ball zones (i.e., basketball zone, 4-square zone) and low-energy zones (i.e., hopscotch, skipping, walking). Next, we will be teaching our students positive playground expectations this month and promoting active supervision and implementing enhanced techniques for all supervising adults using the SBCI Outdoor Ball Strike Prevention Tool Kit. Education Quality and Accountability Office





This year, most students in grades 3 and 6 will complete the EQAO assessment **online** using the Ministry of Education's e-assessment system.

Grade 3 students will write the Primary Division EQAO assessment. The Primary Division EQAO assessment assesses the reading, writing, and mathematics skills students are expected to have learned by the end of Grade 3.

Grade 6 students will write the Junior Division EQAO assessment. The Junior Division EQAO assessment assesses the reading, writing, and mathematics skills students are expected to have learned by the end of Grade 6.


The language component is divided into four sessions requiring a total of approximately two hours. Each session is designed to be completed in 15 to 30 minutes.

The mathematics component contains four stages requiring a total of approximately two hours. Each stage is designed to be completed in approximately 30 minutes.

Southwood students are scheduled to write the EQAO between **May 31st to June 8th**. Grade 3 and 6 families will be notified of exact dates soon.

Please do not book vacations or appointments during this time to ensure that your child can complete the assessment with the other children in the classroom. Please contact your child's teacher if you have any questions. Visit **EQAO Home Page** for more information.
